



**ATHENS-CLARKE COUNTY
LOCAL AMENDMENTS

STATE PLUMBING CODE**

Article 7. Plumbing Code

Section 7-1-166. Provisions cumulative.

The provisions of this article are cumulative to the provisions of the Plumbing Code adopted in Section 7-1-1(8).

Section 7-1-167. Licensing of plumbers.

(a) License required. Before any person shall engage in the plumbing business, he shall be qualified as set forth in this chapter, and a license shall be obtained from Athens-Clarke County as required. Any plumbing work done under a State of Georgia master plumber's license shall at all times be under the immediate supervision and control of a master or journeyman plumber.

(b) Qualifications. Whosoever desires to enter the plumbing business or offers plumbing services shall appear before the Chief Building Official and provide proof of a plumbing license issued by the State of Georgia and a business license issued by Athens-Clarke County.

Section 7-1-172 Fees.

No permit shall be valid until the fees prescribed in Title 7, Article 11 have been paid. No amendment to a permit shall be approved until the additional fees, if any, have been paid.

Section 7-1-173. Name, license or bond used to obtain permit fraudulently.

No person engaged in the business of plumbing shall allow his name to be used by any person directly or indirectly to obtain a permit or for the construction of any work under his name, license or bond; nor shall he make any misrepresentations or omissions in his return.

Section 7-1-174. Sewage disposal; proposed buildings.

Where an application is made for a permit for the construction of a building, the Chief Building Official shall require a showing by the applicant as to the method of sewage disposal that is planned as part of the proposed construction. Where a septic tank system is planned for the disposal of liquid waste from the building or building(s) to be constructed, the applicant shall furnish the Chief Building Official with a copy of an individual sewage disposal system construction permit or other written authorization of the Clarke County Health Department.
